How many apps do you have on your phone/iPad or computer? An app is a shortened term for "Application". Apps perform a set of routines and functions as defined by the end -user. There are many different types of apps that include entertainment, education and helps to increase productivity. The Brass Cross on the front of the Memorial Table was a Wedding gift to Bob and Kathy, which they have donated and attached to adorn this beautiful Table. What a great addition for families to use during Memorial Services.

Communion

Beginning the first Saturday in June, Communion will be served at the Communion rail and will be provided with one Pastor and one Elder. During the Summer months with some Elders and Communion assistants vacationing, spending more time returning North with family, it becomes more difficult to schedule coverage during this time, so the decision was made to make this minor change. There may be a 'hiccup' or two the first couple of times, so please be patient. There will not be any change to the current Communion distribution during both Sunday morning services.

District Convention

The Florida/Georgia District Convention will be held June 16 - 18, 2022. Each Church has 2 voting Delegates at this Convention to vote in business matters for the District.

Trinity's Pastoral Delegate is Pastor Blair Clark and our Lay Delegate is Dennis Esch, Stewardship Chair. They will be voting, on behalf of Trinity. During the Convention this year, a new Florida/ Georgia District President will be elected as current President Rev. Dr. Gregory Walton is term limited and cannot be re-elected.

There are 5 candidates nominated for the President position and they are; Rev. Dr. Victor Belton, Rev. Keith Lingsch, Rev. Dean Pfeffer, Rev. James Rockey and Rev. Dr. Jeffrey Skopak.

Villages/Bushnell Property

We continue to monitor the Villages plans moving south of the Turnpike and now South of route 470, as they continue moving south closer to the Bushnell property. They have now identified 3 neighborhoods, The Village of Waters Edge, the Village of Shady Brooke & The Village of Moultrie Creek, all South of route 470, (which they have re-named to Central Parkway). Infrastructures have started in these areas as they continue to expand the Villages South. In the original announcement from the Villages, they stated their plans are to build 13,000+ homes south of route 470.

The home on the Bushnell property continues to be occupied by a woman and her elementary school age son, and she is covering all cost on the property except our Insurance and Mortgage payment.

The Villages property directly across the road from the Bushnell property has already been cleared of a large number of trees, with more to still be cleared, as they continue prep work ahead of the infrastructure work, which will follow.

The Trinity Lutheran Church committee on Global Missions works to inspire our fellow Christians to spread the Gospel throughout the world by any and all God pleasing methods.

LCMS Missionary Focus-What Do Missionaries Do?

The main priority of a missionary is to bring the saving Gospel of Jesus Christ to people who have never heard the Good News. LCMS missionaries usually share that Good News in the language of the people they serve. When the Holy Spirit begins to gather people into Christian fellowship, missionaries assist these new Christians in forming their own Indigenous church leaders.

Today, the LCMS trains, sends and supports called and appointed career, long-term and short-term missionaries in various countries around the world and in the United States where there are mission stations, partner churches, schools or mission relationships. LCMS missionary teams are made up of people who focus on planting churches, leadership formation or some type of locally initiated holistic services in areas of health, agriculture, community development, English-as-a- Foreign-Language classes or partner support activities.

Missionary teachers also serve in international schools where missionary children, expatriates, and often national children attend. Agricultural and medical missionaries are utilized when their work will strategically contribute towards reaching and gathering a community of believers, so that churches can be planted. Missionaries usually spend a good deal of time when they first arrive on the field developing language skills, learning about the culture, and mastering a foreign language. The overall LCMS mission "team" consists of ordained pastors, directors of Christian education, directors of Christian outreach, deaconesses, teachers, lay ministers, Directors of Parish music, medical professionals, agriculturalists, vicars, church work program interns, retired Lutheran laity and college graduates. All are scattered across the globe collaborating with national partners to tell the Good News of the salvation that is found only in Jesus Christ.

From Ethiopia

Rev. Eric and Johanna Stinnett serve the Lord through The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) in Ethiopia. Eric teaches at Mekane Yesus Seminary in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. This seminary is dedicated to training faithful Lutheran pastors and other church workers to serve in Ethiopia. Eric was born in Great Falls, Mont. He earned a bachelor's degree in pharmacy from the University of Montana, Missoula. He received his Master of Divinity from Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Ind. Prior to becoming a missionary, Eric worked as a hospital clinical staff pharmacist and as a triple parish pastor at Trinity Lutheran Church, Stanford, Mont., Our Savior Lutheran Church, Denton, Mont., and St. Paul Lutheran Church, Lewistown, Mont. She earned bachelor's degrees in biology and nursing from the University of Windsor and is a registered nurse. Before heading to Ethiopia, Johanna served as an obstetrics nurse at Hutzel Women's Hospital, Detroit, and with Benefits Health Systems, Great Falls, Mont. In her free time, she enjoys gardening, reading, playing the piano, being an organist and teaching choir. Eric and Johanna have four beautiful children –Rachael, Naomi, Luke and Levi–who join them on the mission field.

Pray God gives their entire family strength and peace as they continue to adjust to life overseas, learning the culture and the language. Pray for the church in Ethiopia and for the students attending Mekane Yesus Seminary. THE SEWING ANGELS



Since the last Tidings, the Sewing Angels have distributed

- 37 Laundry bags to Kids Central
- 4 Floor pillows to GG's House
- 33 Hygiene bags t GG's House

Also, a member picked up a quilt for someone and a walker bag was taken – which we love to see in our record book. Those beautiful items don't do anyone any good sitting on our shelves. We make them to bless others! Please feel free to stop by our closet in the Fellowship Hall (under the stairs) and pick out something special to bless someone in need of a little TLC.

Although our distribution of our handmade items has been light the last few weeks, we are still very busy! We continue making blankets for CAMP SOZO. The Ocala National Forest hosts the summer camp for around 300 underprivileged children from the forest, starting the first week of June and running throughout the summer. The lightweight blankets we have been making are simply made from three layers of lightweight cotton (no batting), sewn together and then tied throughout the middle. Most of the blankets end up to be around 72" long and 40"-42" wide. We can use less than perfect fabrics for the "middles" of the blankets. As you can see from the picture (below) we have really gone through lots of old sheets and yards of fabric and our cupboard are looking a little bare. So if you can help by donating gently used sheets (any size, shape or color), we would appreciate it – and so would the kiddos! Choosing a blanket when campers arrive is part of the start of their stay. They "go crazy" for those homemade blankets. And Sewing Angels "go crazy" making fun blankets, using kid's prints and fabrics that we don't use for anything else. The project is a win win!

In cooperation with the newly formed Christian Cancer Care Blessings (CCCB), we have been cutting fleece blankets and getting them ready for volunteers to tie. These blankets are purchased as kits – which CCCB paid for and we finish for them! It is a very simple task, for a very worthwhile project. The end result is a really cozy lap blanket (about 40" X 60") which is included in the CCCB bags. If you would like to finish one of the blankets by taking it home and tying it, or finishing it on a Friday afternoon with us, please give me a call.

As Sue Lehota, and some of you, "migrate" back up north for the summer, we pray for your safe travels and look forward to having you all back in the fall! I will probably continue to meet on most Friday afternoons during the summer. We get a lot of "house" cleaning, sorting, and tidying-up done during that time – and who doesn't need to clean out those closests once in a while! Newcomers are always welcome!!!
