### Dear Fellow Redeemed,



LoveInc was conceived in 1977 as a way to mobilize local churches to transform lives and communities in the name of Christ. From its earliest beginnings, LoveInc has served as a Clearinghouse to bring church members into direct contact with the needy folks living in their communities. It is, at its most fundamental level, Christians coming together to serve individuals and families who are less fortunate. It is an answer to prayer. LoveInc in Summerfield, is one of 150 affiliates in 30 states. The congregations and community partners which make up each affiliate, meet serious and various essential needs in their locale. Trinity is one of those 40 congregations in our area. The LoveInc motto is "meeting needs and changing lives". Once a screened individual or family's particular need is identified, our volunteers work one on one with them to accomplish a goal which has been set. The client must show a true desire to change the situation they find themselves in. The needs vary. Some are homeless. Some are unemployed. Many are working, but don't earn enough to cover rent, utilities and food bills. Others are lonely and discouraged. These are people who need a helping hand and LoveInc is there to assist. They need a hand up, not a hand out. This is an ongoing process. At the heart of LoveInc are volunteers motivated by the desire to share God's love and inspired by Jesus's example of selfless giving. It enables these Christians to pool their time, talents and treasure to create a network of resources and services to respond to concerns in the community. Together, they provide tangible assistance, encouragement and programs to meet immediate needs and, in many cases, teach people life skills so that they become more LoveInc about helping churches help people. It is Christians working together, across denominational lines, to transform lives and communities in the name of Christ. Every time I imagine this picture, I think of the old hymn "Onward Christian Soldiers." Why not join the army of volunteers marching with "the cross of Jesus going on before." The last 2 distributions listed were from my stay in Ohio this summer. My husband and I helped with VBG for Christ Lutheran church in Mantua, Ohio. We were in charge of outdoor games. It had a pet theme. Everyday there was a different speaker related to pets. Amber's Ark of nearby Ravenna Ohio spoke one day. She was very happy to accept the 10 Pet beds to help with her animal rescue.

Christ Lutheran Church was blessed with a new young pastor straight out of the seminary. When Pastor Blake Martzowka arrived in Mantua to begin his ministry he was newly married. Shortly thereafter they were expecting a baby. She was born in August. I spoke with Ruth Martzowka about the sewing projects done by the Sewing Angels and she was happy to pick out 10 baby washcloths for their little one.

I would like to tell you a bit more about the care kit drawstring bags. The drawstring bags are filled with all the basics a child would need when having an emergency removal from the home. We are shocked at how quickly we need to replenish the supply. Gewing Angels member Julia Mack who is on the board for the Gozo Kids inquired why they are going through them so quickly. She was told there is a big problem with Fentanyl laced drugs taking the lives of the parents or rendering them unfit to continue in their parenting role. Please keep these kids in your prayers!

Another project that was done by the sewing Angels recently was recovering the Office pew cushion and making 2 new pillows. It was made with fabric that was donated to us. Next time you're in the office check it out!

Right now we are working on putting together quilts for the baby and children's ministries. We will be making these distributions very soon.

If you are interested in helping this awesome ministry out, we need the following: washcloths or towels we can make into washcloths and bars of soap. They need not be new! If you have a bath towel or beach towel with stains or holes we can cut around them to make washcloths. The soap can be bath size or hotel sized. Please either drop them off at the Church office or put them in the Sewing Angels donation bin in meeting room 4 at the back of the church.

If you or someone you know have use for a wheelchair or walker bag please stop by the welcome center and pick one out!

If you would like to join us in this outreach there are many sewing and non sewing tasks we can use help with. We meet on Thursday mornings from 9-noon. If you have any questions or suggestions for the Sewing Angels please contact the Church Office to get contact information.

### District Members Participate in Kenya Mission Trip

During this past August, 2024, several Florida-Georgia District members and two additional individuals participated in a mission trip to Point of Grace Academy (POGA) outside Kisumu. Kenva.

For 13 years, POGA has given a topnotch education to the students from all
areas of Kenya. From its start in 2011
— with just 11 students — it had grown
to more than 600 elementary students
and more than 200 high school students.
POGA provides for their spiritual growth
with chapel services, as well as religious
instruction during the week. This past
year, POGA added
a clinic to their campus,
which services the student body as well
as the surrounding community. This clinic
currently sees approximtely 50 people
weekly, providing standard medical care.

During the week-long trip, team members worked with the students and taught religious stories. They also helped in the medical clinic assisting the technicians and workers. Each morning began with a delicious breakfast before beginning the various activities of the day. The group received a Bible verse each day to contemplate as they went about their activities. The group met regularly for a delicious lunch and then began afternoon activities which included discussion with groups of students or playing some games.

Supper followed the afternoon activities with a devotion lead by Pastor Dennis Meeker, one of the founders of POGA. On Saturday the group hosted a supper for the students — helping serve the meal. The meal consisted of rice, chicken, chapati (flatbread), cabbage, and watermelon, along with a soda to drink. This meal helped the students and team to get to know one another.

On Sunday the group worshiped at the POGA chapel, with the FLGA District pastors helping in the service. Pastor Jeff Moore preached on John 6 and Pastor Tim Brown lead the liturgy. The children sang beautifully during this service.

On Monday, the group handed out dresses and shorts sewn by the FLGA and Michigan District LWML to the girls and boys of POGA. They also sorted through the donated supplies for the classrooms and the pharmacy — including supplies, clothing items, Bibles and catechisms that had been in checked luggage — 32 bags in total.

# TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH CHRISTIAN CANCER CARE BLESSINGS MINISTRY

The Christian Cancer Care Blessings (CCCB) project is a ministry of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) of Trinity Lutheran Church (TLC) striving to make living with cancer more comfortable through God's love and blessings.

We have been very busy packing and distributing care bags. On October 25<sup>th</sup>, with the help of the LWML, we packed 50 bags. Each bag contained a Pocket Prayer Book or N.T. Bible, a Cancer Pamphlet, a colorful bookmark and scripture message along with hand lotion and lip balm, and a special personal note of encouragement. Also included were donated items such as boxed teas, sugar free cough drops, hard candy, puzzle books, mechanical pencils, and non-skid socks. There were beautiful handmade lap blankets, crosses and hearts, and small bags containing a port pillow and a tissue holder. All items donated and made with love.

Remember that **YOU** are a part of this ministry. Cancer Care bags can be picked up at the Welcome Desk, at no charge, and can be delivered in person to someone needing God's comfort. If you would like us to send a bag out of state, please leave the name and address information at the Welcome Desk and someone will send it for you, also at no cost. Recently, we have mailed care bags to New Jersey, New York and Michigan.

This is an ongoing ministry and we will need to replenish our supplies. Supplies donated and/or handmade by you can be dropped off in Room 4. Our bin is located in the back and marked CCCB. Thank you for your generosity. We would not be able to provide this ministry without donations. If you would like to donate for materials that we need to purchase or funds for mailing, please put CCCB on the memo line of your check.





The Trinity Choir is busy with our fall schedule of music and hope to inspire your worship service with some new songs as well as traditional songs. We rehearse on Wednesdays at 6:00 pm and would love for you to join us. We usually sing twice a month at both services with some exceptions. You do not need to know how to read music to sing in a choir. We know that this wonderful commitment to serve our Lord is using the gifts He gave us. Whether you used to sing in a choir or never have, we invite you to experience this rewarding ministry and fellowship as we share our love for God and each other.



The Bells of Trinity make beautiful music with hand bells and chimes. We rehearse on Wednesdays at 1:30 pm and would love to have you visit sometime just to see what it is all about. We will show you how and when to ring a bell so that your bell in combination with other bells produces the sounds that you hear on Sunday mornings. You do not need to be able to sing to ring a bell. If you can count to 4, you're in. We play one Sunday a month at both services and send the presence of God ringing through the sanctuary on a musical tone.





The Devotional Drum Ensemble consists of several members playing multiple rhythm instruments accompanying your favorite hymns. 
